Fair Chance Job Fair Draws 259 Job Seekers and 21 Employers & Community Partners!

The Fargo office hosted their Fair Chance Job Fair on June 4, and it was an exciting day filled with opportunity, collaboration and community support. A total of 21 employers and community partners participated, with activities taking place both inside our office and in our parking lot.

The Heart n' Soul Food Truck served delicious meals with their "Pay what you can" model, while another partner, Deep Roots Recovery, shared their mission of providing sustainable recovery support and gave goodies away to interested job seekers. North Dakota State College of Science (NDSCS) brought its interactive driving simulator, and our very own DJ Foysal kept the energy high throughout the event.

This hiring event attracted 259 job seekers, all eager to connect with employers committed to fair chance hiring. Community partners were also on hand to provide valuable information about employment services, training opportunities and supportive services. Employers had great things to say about the event:

Summer Summit for Youth: Preparing Tomorrow's Workforce

The Fargo Workforce Center recently hosted its annual Summer Summit, a two-day workshop designed to inspire, educate, and equip youth ages 16–21 as they prepare for their future careers. This year, 11 youth registered, representing four languages: English, French, Kinyarwanda, and Spanish. With interpreters and accommodations available, every participant had the opportunity to fully engage in the experience. Throughout the workshop, participants explored a variety of career readiness topics and activities, including:

WIOA Success Story: Training Today, Career Tomorrow

After facing challenges that included leaving high school during the pandemic and working minimum-wage jobs, Uriel Scott was ready for a fresh start. He earned his GED and completed the STRIVE Future Leaders program, where he gained valuable workplace skills, industry certifications, and the confidence to pursue a career with greater opportunities.

After relocating to North Dakota to care for his mother, Uriel connected with Job Service North Dakota's Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) program. With the support of his WIOA Advisor, he was able to enroll in Lynnes Welding Training. The Good Jobs Challenge and WIOA funding covered his tuition in full, helping eliminate a major financial barrier to entering the skilled trades. Uriel has now completed the four-month welding program and received 10 certifications.

He went on several interviews and received four great job offers. He is now working as a Tank Welder at O'Day Tank & Steel. He credits WIOA and their partnership with the FMWF Chamber, along with the support and training he received through STRIVE, for helping him build the skills and confidence needed to achieve his career goals. "WIOA gave me the opportunity to pursue a career I was excited about without worrying about the cost of training. It helped put me on a path toward a stable future." Uriel's story is a great example of how the WIOA program and community resources come together to help eligible individuals access education and training that lead to in-demand careers, stronger wages, and long-term success.

Armstrong Appoints Phil Davis to Serve as Interim Executive Director of Job Service North Dakota.

Governor Kelly Armstrong recently announced the appointment of Workforce Service Director Phil Davis as Interim Executive Director of Job Service North Dakota following the retirement of Executive Director Pat Bertagnolli on June 12.

Davis joined Job Service North Dakota in 2007 as an industry liaison and was promoted in 2008 to customer service area manager for the central and western parts of North Dakota, overseeing the daily operations of six Job Service workforce centers. He was promoted to workforce service director in 2019, overseeing all nine workforce centers across the state as well as another unit that administers 15 different workforce programs.

A Mandan native, Davis enlisted in the U.S. Air Force after high school and spent 21 years in the Air Force as an air traffic controller, serving at several air bases across the world including in Iraq. While in the military, he earned a bachelor's degree in business and aviation management from Embry Riddle Aeronautical University in Daytona Beach, Florida. Job Service North Dakota has approximately 159 full-time team members, 76 temporary employees and a biennial budget of \$79.1 million to manage multiple federal grants for workforce and unemployment services.
