FEDERAL BONDING PROGRAM

The Federal Bonding Program is an employer incentive to hire job applicants that may have background risk factors. The program doesn't cost you or the employer, but it can help you get, and keep, a job.

PRIORITY OF SERVICE FOR VETERANS AND ELIGIBLE SPOUSES

Veterans and eligible spouses who meet all the eligibility requirements for a program or service will receive access to the program or service either earlier in time or instead of persons who are not eligible for priority of service.

ELIGIBLE VETERAN

A person who served in the active military and who was discharged or released under conditions other than dishonorable.

ELIGIBLE SPOUSE

- The spouse of a veteran who died of a service-connected disability.
- The spouse of any member of the Armed Forces serving on active duty who, at the time of application for assistance is listed in one or more of the following categories and has been so listed for a total of more than 90 days.
 - (i) Missing in action.
 - (ii) Captured in line of duty by a hostile force.
 - (iii) Forcibly detained or interned in line of duty by a foreign government or power.
- The spouse of a veteran who has a total

disability or who died while a total disability resulting from service existed as evaluated by the Department of Veterans Affairs.

VETERANS AND ELIGIBLE PERSONS

One-on-one assistance with a member of the Veterans' Employment Team may be available for veterans or eligible persons who are having difficulty in finding or retaining employment. As veterans themselves, the team understands the many transitions veterans experience as they move from military to civilian life. The team is trained and ready to provide assistance to help work through employment barriers.

One of the biggest hurdles veterans face is "selling" their military experience to civilian employers who may not understand military lingo. The Veterans' Employment Team can help translate military skills and experience into civilian terms so employers can readily understand all that a veteran has to offer and how those skills will benefit their business.


In addition, the Veterans' Employment Team can:

- Offer career guidance and planning.
- Make referrals to training opportunities.
- Offer resume writing and interview techniques training.
- Make referrals to supportive services and local resources.

RESOURCE CENTERS

Resource centers are located in each Job Service office for your use - *at no charge*. Experienced staff are on site to provide assistance when needed.

- Find occupational information, training and education sources.
- Job search related workshops (vary by office).

WORKFORCE INNOVATION AND OPPORTUNITY ACT

The Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) program is a federal program that provides job training, education, and employment services to eligible customers. The program is aimed at improving employability, expanding earning potential, and helping participants retain a job. WIOA serves adults, dislocated workers, and youth.

Job Service North Dakota administers the following workforce programs:

CLASSROOM TRAINING

Improving job skills is an important part of job success. Financial assistance may be available for vocational or other educational programs. Opportunities for occupational skills and basic or remedial skill development may also be available to assist individuals toward obtaining a credential, degree, or certification. Participants must explore additional sources of funding for school.

ON-THE-JOB TRAINING

Individuals may have the opportunity to learn skills on the job rather than attending school. Funds may be available to help the employer with training costs when a connection can be made with an employer to train participants for a permanent job.

WORK EXPERIENCE

A short-term job or internship with a public, nonprofit, or private-for-profit business can provide employment skills and job experience. Worksite locations are intended to relate to your career goals, abilities, and interests to give you the skills to compete for regular employment.

SUPPORT SERVICES

Job Service North Dakota may be able to assist with support services if financial challenges keep participants from taking part in a WIOA program. Job Service North Dakota must approve support service requests before participants obtain them.

OUT OF AREA JOB SEARCH OR RELOCATION

Assistance with the cost of traveling to job interviews or relocating for work in North Dakota may be available. Assistance must be pre-approved by Job Service.

YOUTH SERVICES

(AGE 24 AND YOUNGER)

These services are designed to assist eligible youth in establishing and completing educational and career goals. Activities may include the following:

- Tutoring or study skills training.
- Summer employment opportunities related to school and career goals.
- Paid and unpaid work experiences.
- Job shadowing.
- Occupational or post-secondary training at a college/approved training facility or with an employer.
- Leadership development opportunities.
- Career planning and exploration.
- Alternative secondary schools.
- Financial literacy.
- Entrepreneurial skills training.
- Labor market information.
- Transition to post-secondary and training.
- Workforce preparation activities offered concurrently with education.

REGISTERED APPRENTICESHIP

Registered Apprenticeship is a structured training program combining paid on-the-job training with related technical instruction in a highly skilled occupation. It is used for both non-union and union career opportunities. Students earn, learn, and succeed!

LABOR MARKET INFORMATION

Labor Market Information assists with the career decision-making process. Find a wealth of information on career planning and exploration, wages, benefits, employment projections, community data and more on jobsnd.com.

UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE

Use any personal computer or one in a Job Service resource center to file or reopen an unemployment insurance claim.
