On The Job Training Program

On the Job Training is a planned, structured learning experience providing reimbursement to employers to offset the costs of training.

Employer Benefits: OJT positions are full time (minimum 32 hours per week). Part time may be allowed in some situations. OJT positions are generally entry level. The employer is reimbursed monthly for up to 50% of the hourly wage for a period up to six months. The employer is responsible for all payroll taxes and Workforce Safety & Insurance coverage. The length of the program is based on the skill level of the position and an assessment of the participant's skills, education and work background. Some low skills positions may not qualify.

Program Requirements: Approval for the OJT must be prior to hiring or promoting selected individual. Trainees must meet eligibility guidelines. The expectation is for the participant to be employed fulltime after successful completion of the training.



Our first Talent Tuesday was held May 28th. Nordic Fiberglass, North Plains Utility Contracting and Gleason Construction were the businesses that were a part of the inaugural event. They were able to meet with current job seekers and interview on the spot.







CHI/St. Alexius Hospital and SAAF (Safe Alternatives for Abused Families) were the two organizations on hand for our second event in June.

The July event will be the first Tuesday on the 2nd as we welcome Les Schwab Tires into the workforce center and the community. This event will be from 2-5, however. When looking for employees, remember to post your job openings on jobsnd.com as an additional recruitment source. It is the single largest job board in North Dakota and receives about 55,000 visitors and 235 new applicant registrations per week...and it's always FREE.

Work Opportunity Tax Credit is a Tax Credit for ND employers and can provide employers up to \$9,600 per qualifying new hire during their first year of employment. Forms need to be postmarked no later than the 28th calendar day following the new employee's employment start date.

Job Service administers the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) federal training program. <u>Two components I'd like to highlight are On-The-Job Training (OJT) and Work Experience.</u>

- If Job Service can determine that an applicant you are considering hiring is eligible for OJT, we can write a contract with your company to pay for up to ½ of their wage for up to 6 months as an incentive for you to hire and train the individual. The contract must be signed before the individual begins working for your company.
- The purpose of the Work Experience program is to get work experience for our younger customers (generally ages 16-24) and again Job Service must determine they are eligible. This person would be considered an employee of Job Service and we pay the entire wage and worker's compensation. After the allotted number of hours is completed, you are under no obligation to hire the person on your payroll. If you would like to be considered as a potential Work Experience worksite, please call and we'll discuss it further. All paperwork needs to be signed before the person can begin employment.

Hiring Events are an excellent way to visit with potential job candidates. If you choose to have a hiring event virtually, or at your place of business, or at our center, contact me for more information on how we can assist. We will display your flyer in our Resource Room for job seekers to review and throughout the community, as well as post the flyer on our Devils Lake Job Service ND Facebook.
