New American Employment Program

The State of North Dakota is working together with employers and community partners to offer training, employment and other support to refugees and other newly arrived individuals so they can live, work and thrive in their new communities.

In October of 2023, Job Service North
Dakota started a new program in
partnership with the North Dakota Office of
Refugee Services assisting new arrivals with
skill acquisition and employment. Sabina
Abaza and Bridget Hill are the New
American Employment Program Career
Navigators in Fargo.

They meet with new arrivals that are referred to Job Service through partners like Global Refuge and the Adult Learning Center.

Career Navigators together with new arrivals set training and employment goals and work towards achieving those goals. New arrivals bring a variety of skills and experiences that greatly contribute to North Dakota's workforce.

Since October, Sabina and Bridget have enrolled 155 participants (61 from Haiti and 38 from Congo.) They are helping these individuals find quality employment with an average wage of \$18 per hour.

One of the biggest barriers newcomers face is the language barrier. Some examples of the first languages we see are Haitian Creole, Arabic, Swahili, French, Urdu and Somali.

What is the Work Opportunity Tax Credit?

The Work Opportunity Tax Credit (WOTC) program is an income tax credit incentive provided by the Internal Revenue Service and the U.S. Department of Labor, Employment and Training Administration. The one-time tax credit is available to forprofit employers hiring individuals in the target groups listed below and to tax-exempt organizations that hire qualified veterans. North Dakota employers can receive a tax credit up to \$9,600 per qualifying new employee during their first year of employment. There is no limit to the number of new hires that can qualify.

What are the WOTC target groups and who may qualify?

- Unemployed Veterans (including disabled veterans)
- Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) Recipients
- · Food Stamp (SNAP) Recipients
- Designated Community Residents (living in Empowerment Zones or Rural Renewal Counties)
- Vocational Rehabilitation Referred Individuals
- Ex-Felons
- Supplemental Security Income Recipients
- · Qualified Long-Term Unemployed
- Summer Youth Employees (living in Empowerment Zones


Job Placement Pilot Program (JP3)

An Overview of JP3

The Job Placement Pilot Program assists individuals who are justice involved and are within 90 days of their release. Individuals can obtain a referral from their Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (DOCR) case manager once they have completed the Career Readiness class offered by Job Service ND at their correctional facility. Currently Bismarck and Fargo Job Service offices offer the JP3 Program. The program is designed to assist participants with accessing employment services and opportunities, training programs, individual consultation to be employment ready, referrals to needed services, and funding for support services for gaining and retaining employment. The JP3 staff tailors the services provided to the participants' needs and performs follow-up case management services to ensure the program is a valuable resource for individuals.

Success Story

Tristan Brown was enrolled in the Job Placement Pilot Program (JP3) in October of 2023. While incarcerated he expressed an interest in operating heavy equipment and needing support services for transportation and communicating with employers upon his release. Carrie was his JP3 Employment Advisor and she was able to assist with a one-month bus pass, phone, and phone card to make job searching and work retention easier. Tristan had obtained employment with a heavy equipment company prior to being enrolled in the program, however he still needed support services to be able to work. Carrie was able to work with Tristan to obtain the items required for employment. She also worked with Tristan on exploring job opportunities within the community, and other higher wage opportunities. Tristan became employed as a Laborer at ASN Constructors and worked his way up to a Pile Driver position. He has retained his employment for over six months and has been very successful in the JP3 program.
