Summer Summit: Preparing the Workforce of Tomorrow

The Fargo Workforce Center hosted a two-day Summer Summit for Youth designed to inspire, educate, and equip youth ages 16–21 as they plan for their future. This year, 19 individuals registered and 11 actively participated, representing four languages: English, Arabic, Swahili, and Sudanese Arabic. With interpreters and accommodations provided, every participant had the opportunity to engage fully.

Day One: Wellness & Career Readiness

- Mental Health & Coping Strategies: Rory Beil of Clay County Public Health led a session on mental health, giving youth practical tools to manage stress.
- WIOA Services Presentation: Tonya and Jen introduced participants to WIOA services, sparking lively questions and discussions.
- Career Exploration Games:
 - Interview Jenga to practice job interview questions while playing Jenga.
 - Career Pong where participants registered for VOS accounts and played a fun, interactive game to learn about career pathways.

<u>Day Two: Real-World Insights & Hands-On Learning</u>

- Work Experience Panel: Two participants shared their career journeys and how WIOA has supported their success.
- Cash Confidence: Katelyn from Freedom Resource engaged youth with practical tips on budgeting and financial management.
- Alerus Financial Booth: Participants connected directly with representatives and one youth opened a bank account on-site, while another explored a career in banking.
- <u>CareerViewXR Virtual Reality</u>: Heather introduced VR goggles that allowed participants to "experience" different career paths in an immersive way.

Participants left with new tools, connections, and confidence to take meaningful steps toward their future careers.
